

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Menu Of Interventions For 46 Problem Behaviors

The list, however, isn't intended to be used without first reading SOS, which describes when and how to use these basic methods and techniques for improving behavior.

Aggression — physically aggressive actions including choking, biting, hair pulling, hitting, kicking, pinching, pushing, scratching, slapping, and spitting.

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
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This *Menu Of Interventions* lists more than 46 problem behaviors and over 23 SOS methods for handling and improving these behaviors.
